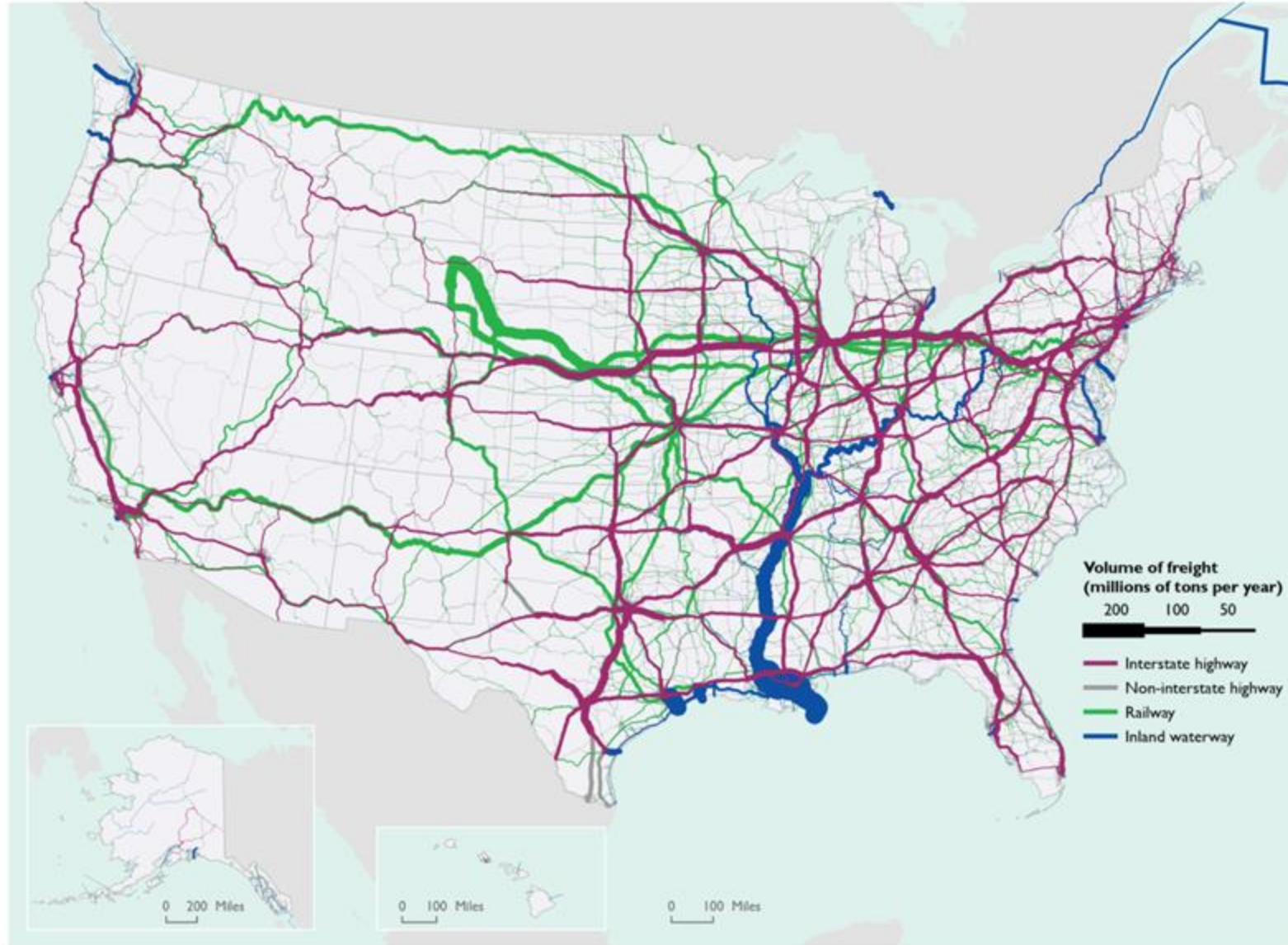

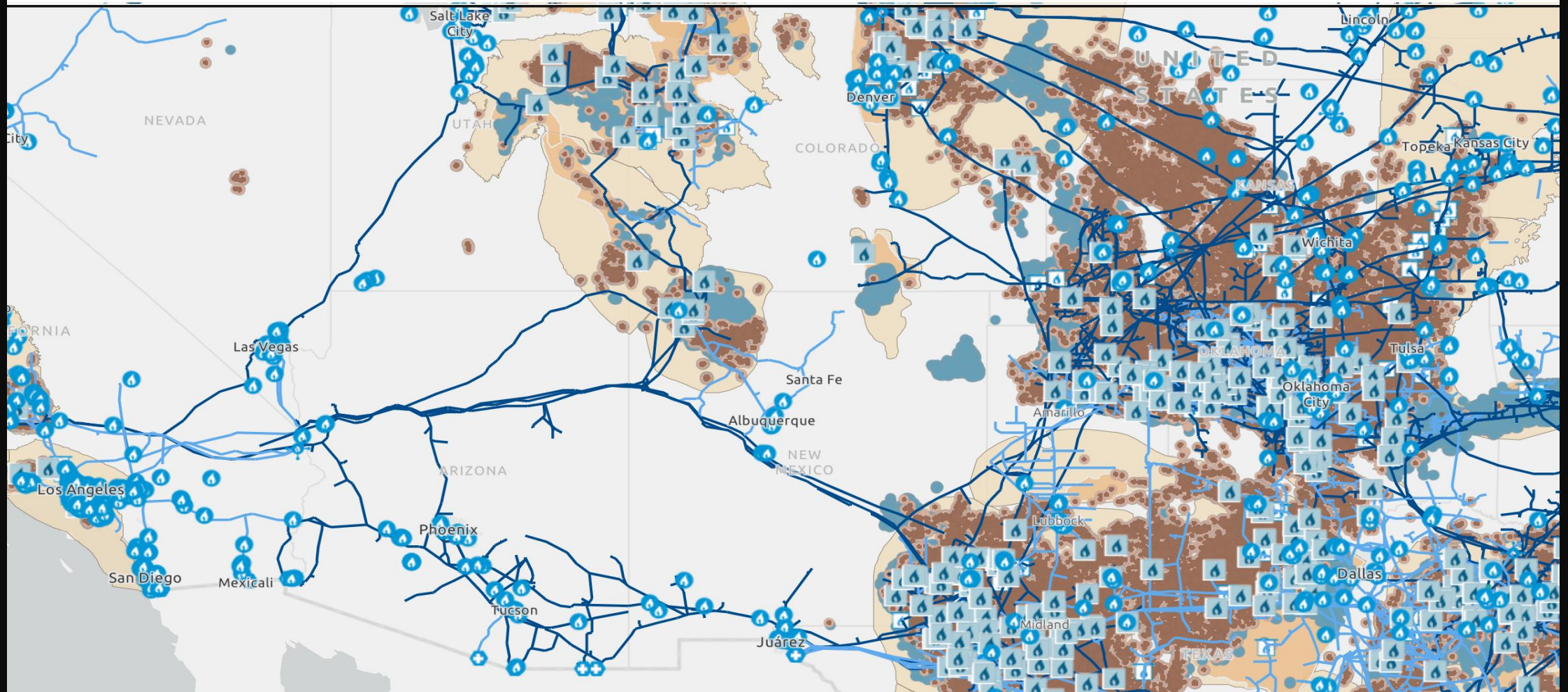


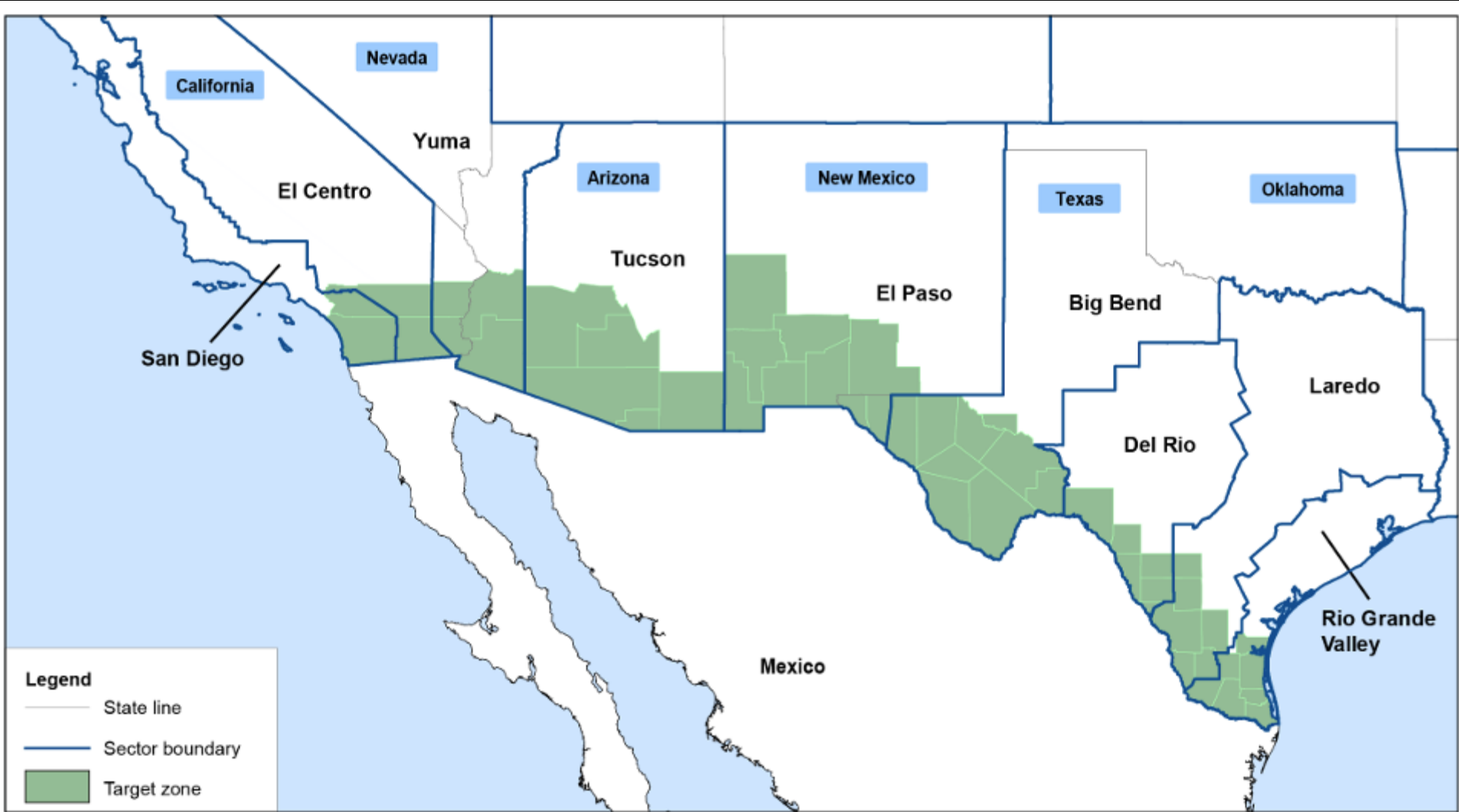


Freight Flows by Highway, Railway, and Waterway: 2018

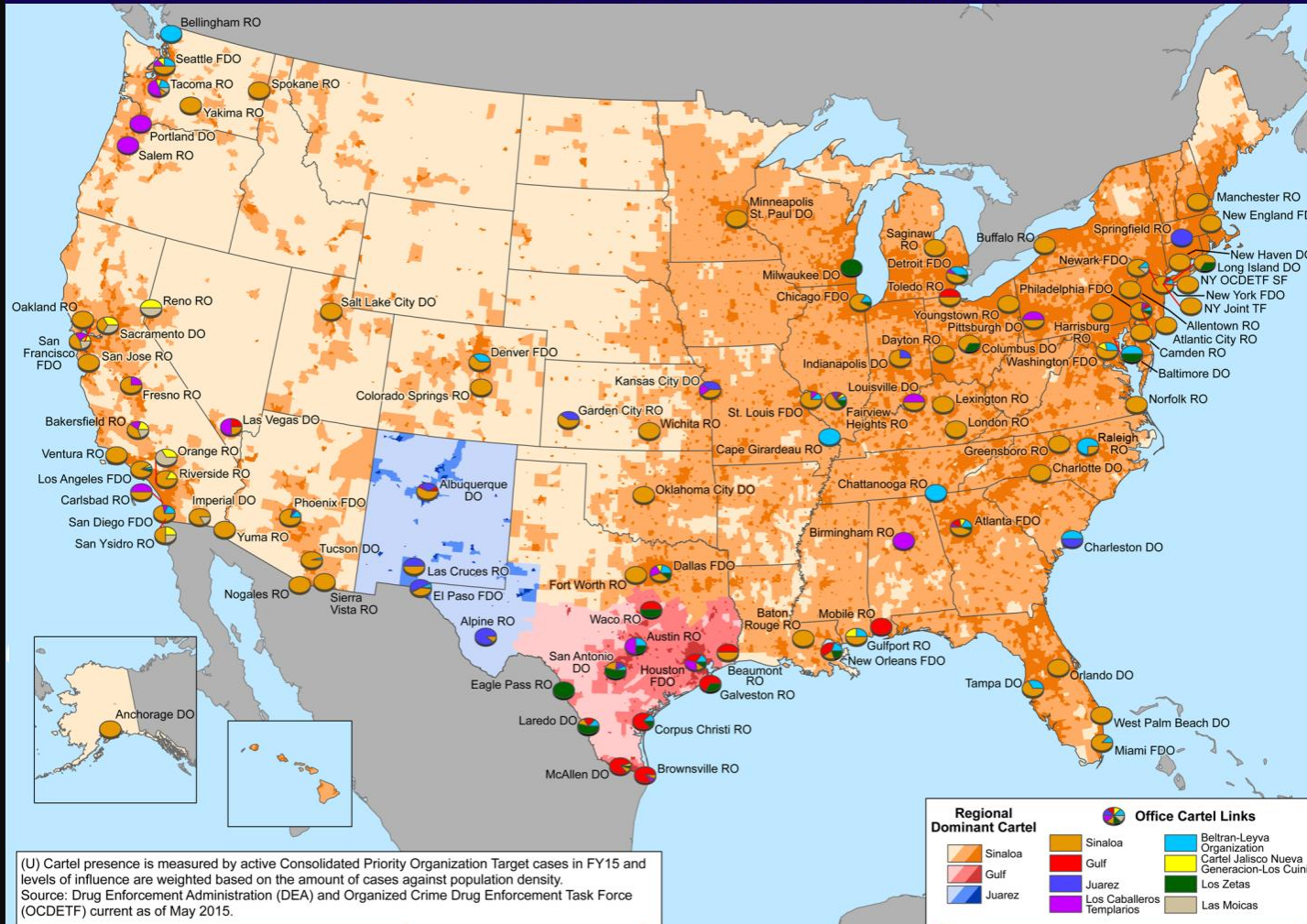

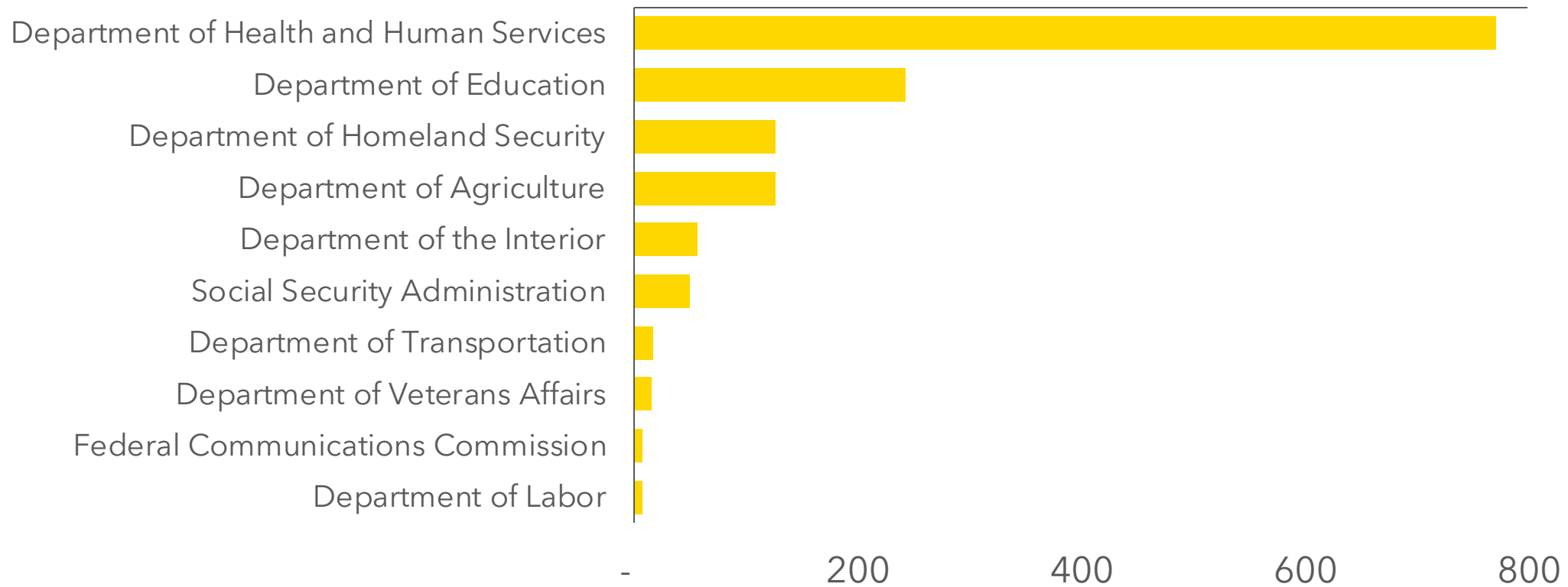
(U) Figure 2: United States: Areas of Influence of Major Mexican Transnational Criminal Organizations

Leading Federal Awarding Agencies In New Mexico, 2015-2023

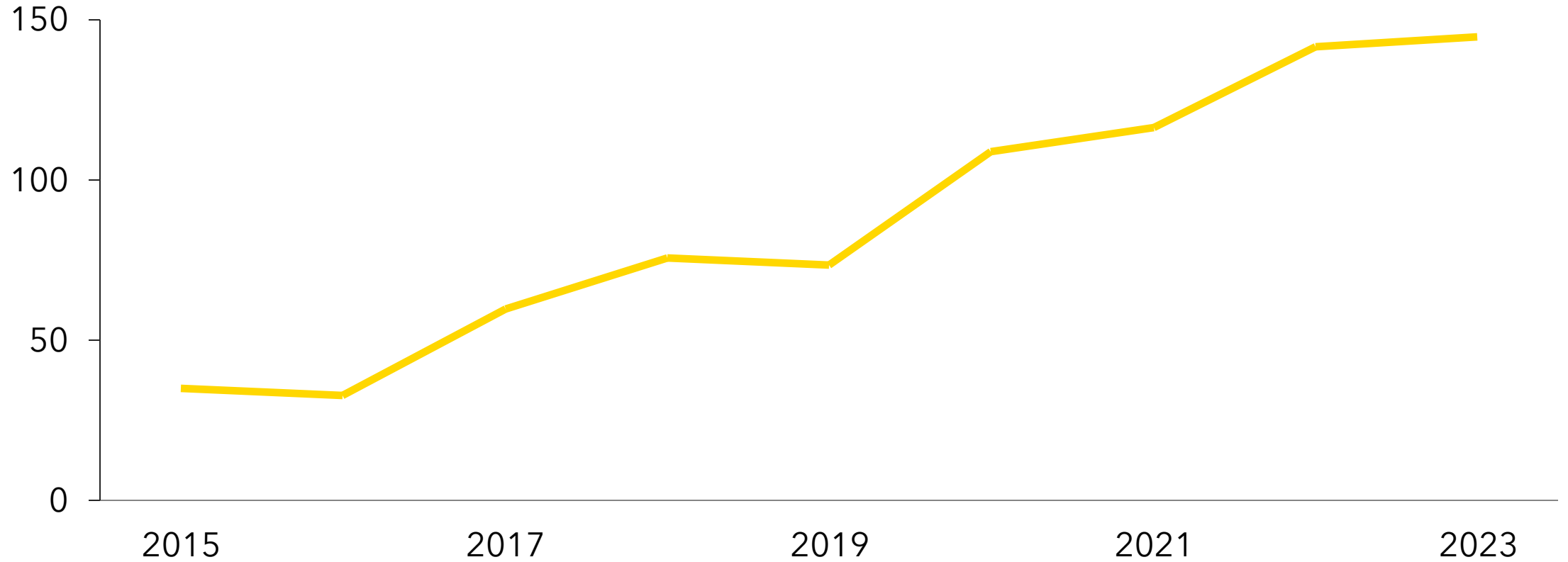

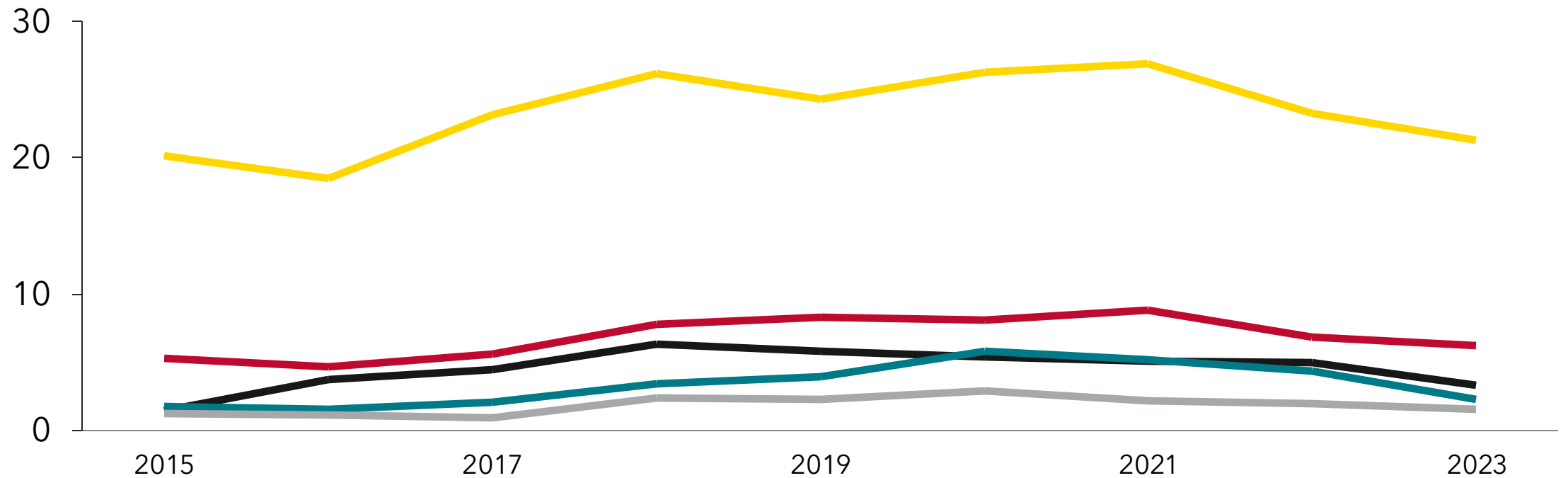

Bipartisan Infrastructure Law: Drinking Water and Wastewater Investments

The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) delivers more than \$50 billion to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) over the next five years to improve our nation's drinking water, wastewater, and stormwater infrastructure - the single largest investment in water that the federal government has ever made. During the first year of funding, 2022, allocations for New Mexico's State Revolving Funds (SRFs) total \$63 million. This investment into our state will mean safe drinking water, clean water for communities and healthier watersheds.

Inflation Reduction Act Funding for Rural Development

In August, Congress passed the Biden-Harris Administration's historic legislative package known as the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) to reduce energy costs for families and create thousands of good-paying jobs for people across rural America. IRA represents the largest single investment in rural electrification since the passage of the Rural Electrification Act in 1936. Sections 22001 through 22005 of IRA provide new loan and grant products and unprecedented incentives to expand clean energy, transform rural power production, create jobs, and spur economic growth to be offered by USDA Rural Development's Rural Utilities Service (RUS) and Rural Business and Cooperative Service (RBCS).

Forestry and Fuels Grants

Community Wildfire Defense (CWDG) Grants

Purpose: Assist at-risk local communities and Indian Tribes with planning and mitigating against the risk created by wildfire. There are two primary project types for which the grant provides funding: The development and revising of Community Wildfire Protection Plans (CWPP), and the implementation of projects described in a CWPP that are less than ten years old.

Who can Apply: Local governments representing communities located in an area with a risk of wildfires, Indian Tribes, Non-profit organizations (including homeowner associations), and State forestry agencies.

Amount: The maximum amount is \$250,000 for the creation or updating of a CWPP and \$10 million for a project described within a CWPP less than 10 years old.

Match: For proposals to develop or update a CWPP, the required match is 10%. For proposals to plan and/or implement projects described in a CWPP is 25%. Communities meeting the definition of underserved and Indian Tribes may request a match waiver.

Deadline: The FY24 Cycle is now open and will close October 31st, 2023.

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AN ACT

RELATING TO FINANCE; CREATING THE NEW MEXICO MATCH FUND;
DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. A new section of the Department of Finance
and Administration Act is enacted to read:

"NEW MEXICO MATCH FUND--CREATED--REPORTING.--

A. The "New Mexico match fund" is created as a
nonreverting fund in the state treasury. The fund consists
of distributions, appropriations, gifts, grants and
donations.

B. The department shall administer the fund, and
money in the fund is appropriated to the department for the
purposes of the fund. The department may use money in the
fund to:

(1) make grants to an eligible entity:

(a) for state matching funds for
federal grants; and

(b) to offset higher project costs
incurred to comply with federal requirements;
